## A few ideas that may help:

- 1) Use the spelling strategies tips explained in the “Guidance for Parents” pages.
- 2) Play games as explained in the “Games Ideas” page.
- 3) Try the following

**right** and **night**: use the mnemonic  
**i go home tonight** (right home!)  
for the **ight** part of these words.

**because**: Most children use the mnemonic  
**big elephants can always understand small elephants**

**our**: This word is commonly confused with **are**. Ask your child to pronounce the word **our** in a posh voice, the way the Queen would say it, with a proper ‘ow’ sound. It will need lots of practice saying it properly in sentences. When reading, encourage your child to pronounce the word correctly.

**grey**: Remember that **e**lephants are grey, so grey spells with an **e**.

**orange**: There are two difficult parts to the spelling of orange.  
**an orange** (in spelling speak, say or–an–ge )  
and remember that English words never end with the letter **j**.  
The **j** sound on the ends of words is almost always spelt with **ge**.
